Rosa María Payá is an internationally respected democracy advocate, human rights leader and expert in Latin American policy, renowned for her efforts to promote freedom, human rights and democratic governance across the Western Hemisphere. She serves as Executive Director of the Foundation for Pan-American Democracy, where she engages with high-level policymakers, including U.S. Congress, European Parliament, and multilateral organizations, to advance regional security, human rights, and democratic stability. She has built an extensive network of influential leaders across the Western Hemisphere and Europe, leveraging her unparalleled credibility to shape impactful initiatives.

She is a respected thought leader with deep ties across Europe, the Americas, and international institutions. A sought-after speaker, Payá has testified before the U.S. Senate, UN Human Rights Council, and parliaments worldwide. Her thought leadership is featured in *The Washington Post, Politico, CNN*, and *El País*.

As the founder of *Cuba Decide*, she spearheads the most prominent prodemocracy movement uniting Cuban civil society, activists, and opposition groups to demand political change through a binding plebiscite.

Daughter of the late Oswaldo Payá, a Sakharov Prize laureate assassinated by the Cuban regime, Rosa María has continued his profreedom legacy with unparalleled determination. Her accolades include the *Morris Abram Human Rights Award* (2019) and *Common-Sense Society Courage Award* (2022).

Launched the Transatlantic Parliamentary Forum

Spearheaded the creation of the Transatlantic Parliamentary Forum, a diverse platform that brings together legislators from Canada, U.S., Europe, and Latin America to coordinate legislative actions aimed at advancing democracy and human rights in Cuba and across the Western Hemisphere. The forum major sessions were held at the U.S. Capitol in 2022 and at the European Parliament (Brussels) in 2024.

Amplified Global Awareness of Cuban Atrocities, international interference and hostile actions against US.

Organized hearings at the U.S. Congress, European Parliament, and UN Human Rights Council, exposing systematic repression and criminal networks of Cuba and gaining support from key stakeholders.

Forged Groundbreaking Multilateral Agreements

Negotiated the Latin American Youth Network's collaboration with the OAS, setting a precedent for youth leadership in regional democratic initiatives.

Unified Regional Youth Movement and Civil Society for Democracy

Founded and led the Latin American Youth Network for Democracy, uniting activists from 20 countries. Coordinated civil society coalitions that shaped international denunciations in key forums such as the Summits of the Americas, exposing human rights violations in Cuba, Nicaragua, and Venezuela.

Elevated Awareness of Communist Crimes

Instrumental in designating July 22 as the *Day of Victims of Communism* in Miami, commemorating the assassination of her father, Oswaldo Payá.

Advanced Democratic Accountability in the EU, Latin America, US and Canada

Led advocacy that influenced European policy, urging the activation of the human rights clause in the EU-Cuba Political Dialogue and Cooperation Agreement and human rights resolutions in several Latin American countries. Her advocacy also contributed to the imposition of Magnitsky sanctions by the U.S. and the advancement of similar strategies within the Canadian Senate.

Established International Recognition for Cuban Human Rights Advocacy

Created the Oswaldo Payá Liberty and Life Prize, awarded to figures like Luis Almagro, OAS Secretary General. Positioned human rights defense as a central issue in hemispheric public discussions.
